Wisdom of Japanese Acupuncture and Moxibustion —Elaboration and Development—

Acupuncture and moxibustion were introduced from China to Japan about 1500 years ago. Through repeated importation of and modeling after the Chinese techniques, acupuncture and moxibustion underwent refinement and growth in Japan and continued with creativity and progression, thus becoming a medical culture unique to Japan. In various periods and districts, diagnostic methods and acupuncture types and techniques unique to Japan and tailored to the inner and outer environments for people were developed.

To date, the following diagnostic methods and acupuncture techniques have been developed to enable appropriate management of intractable diseases and to allow acupuncture attain its logical and universal status as a specialty of medicine.

I Utilization of multi-faceted observation and special medical records: Detailed interview, tongue diagnosis, pulse diagnosis of the stomach qi, and spatial diagnosis, etc., which are unique inspection and palpation.

II Determination of cause and mechanism of the disease, distinction of root and tip of the disease and judgment of favorable/unfavorable pattern/syndrome based on Step I.

III Acupuncture techniques applied without disturbing defense qi: Revival of ancient acupuncture needles and needle tapping, flexural needle insertion, and so on.

IV Realization of treatment with a small number of acupoints through Step II and III (advantageous due to marked enhancement of therapeutic efficacy and reduction of patient burdens).

V Creation of other various theories and acupoint arrangements based on clinical experience.

Among these, studies on steps III and V are expected to further advance.

I will introduce part of the wisdom of Japanese acupuncture and moxibustion in the current age within the time allocated to me.
